The Department of Critical Care Medicine in partnership with the Snyder Institute for Chronic Diseases, Cumming School of Medicine, University of Calgary, invites applications for a Contingent Term full-time academic Intensivist-clinician scientist at the Assistant Professor level with interest in Intersection of Immune Response and Inflammation, Live Cell Imaging or the Microbiome. The position provides 50% of time protected for research. Start-up funds will be available to a qualified candidate. The Department of Critical Care Medicine is closely aligned with the Snyder Institute for Chronic Disease, which has invested in world class research facilities such as a state of the art imaging center. Additionally, the Snyder Institute has led a major initiative to develop the Western Canadian Microbiome Centre. The successful candidate will be an active member of the collaborative research in the Snyder Institute for Chronic Diseases.

Qualifications include an MD, PhD or equivalent, formal research training, and a record of academic research achievements. The applicant should have evidence of prior research in one of the microbiome or intravital imaging and leukocyte endothelial interaction and how this work relates to critical illness or injury. The selected candidate will be expected to compete for a salary award and Tri-Council operating grants. The Clinician Scientist must be eligible for full medical licensure in the Province of Alberta.
