

Associate Staff Intensivist, Paediatric Intensive Care – The Hospital for Sick Children

Primary Description – The candidate must have training and clinical background in pediatric intensive care. Responsibilities include full-time equivalent clinical intensive care practice, and research, education, and administrative responsibilities as required by a Staff Physician in the Department of Critical Care Medicine. Evidence of excellence in teaching and research is required.

Additional Description

The successful candidate must be committed to a career as an academic clinician. The candidate must be eligible for appointment at the rank of Assistant Professor at the University of Toronto. The candidate must be eligible for certification with the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, and licensure with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario.
