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### INTERACTIVE SESSIONS

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The order of the sessions will vary according to the schedule of your group. All group will do all four sessions.

- **PROCEDURAL SESSION**

For this session, participants will be paired and spend 20 min on each of the following 4 stations:

- a) Airway Management (routine tools & difficult airway tools)
- b) Cricothyroidotomy
- c) U/S guided procedures (CVC, peripheral access)
- d) Chest tube/pigtail insertion

The first 5 min will be used for demonstration by the facilitator, and the last 15 min will be used for practice with immediate feedback.



- **LATEST UPDATES**

For this session, participants will attend, as a group, a series of 15-min updates (new guidelines, new practice-changing publications, etc.) on 6 different topics relevant to their practice, including sepsis, non-invasive and invasive ventilation, acute neurological conditions, cardiology, ARDS, and trauma.

Each update will include pre & post quizzes for the participants to complete and Q&A.

- **CASE-BASED DISCUSSIONS**

For this session, four cases will be discussed in small groups with a facilitator. Each 20-minute case will be introduced by the facilitator, and primarily managed (verbally) by one of the participants, with support from colleagues.

The four cases to be discussed will include different presentations and differential diagnosis.

The last 5 min of each case will be used to provide feedback, discuss key aspects of management, and answer participant questions.

- **MANIKIN-BASED SIMULATIONS**

For this session, small group of 3-4 participants will manage 3 scenarios of a clinically deteriorating patient with 2 confederate RN and RT.

Each 15-min scenario will be followed by a 15-min debriefing by the facilitator.
