Specific activities for 2023 have included the following:

- 1. Revising and updating the CCCS Diversity Policy (approved by Board of Directors in 2023)
- 2. Generating a list of EDDI educational resources for CCCS members which will be published on the CCCS website and disseminated via the CCCS newsletter (active, ongoing)
- Developing a proposal for cultural sensitivity and anti-oppression training materials for all CCCS
 Directors and leaders to complete. Phase 1 includes a requirement and support for CCCS
 Executive to complete Indigenous Health Cultural Safety training
- 4. Creating a proposal for enhanced sociodemographic variable collection for CCCS members and for any CCCS-endorsed events (i.e. scientific assemblies, educational events) (approved by Board of Directors in 2023)
- 5. Creating a template for enhanced sociodemographic variable collection at professional meetings
- 6. Enhancing the CCCS website EDDI content (committee members, bios, educational resources) (active, ongoing)
- 7. Collaborate with international societies in critical care medicine to enhance awareness, knowledge and practices related to EDDI (active, ongoing)
- 8. Development of a CCCS position statement on Reconciliation, Decolonization and Indigenous Engagement (accepted for publication in October, 2023)
- 9. Proposal for a dedicated CCCS Indigenous Working Group
- Engagement with the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada Critical Care Medicine Specialty Committee to develop a national curriculum in anti-oppression and social justice for critical care residents across Canada

The CCCS EDDI committee looks forward to actively working to promote anti-oppression and social justice in critical care medicine in Canada and internationally in 2024.
